What is your understanding of how our schools are financed? How could the district maintain a balanced budget?

The district receives revenue from state, local, and federal financial sources. Also, the L'Anse Creuse Foundation assists the district by distributing financial and other resources to students for enrichment programs and other projects. In regards to maintaining a balanced budget, I believe it takes quite a bit of work, dedication and compromise. New ideas and fresh eyes are needed to make sure the right programs and accountability of established programs are monitored appropriately. Being able to develop and maintain a transparent balanced budget should be an annual goal for the Board.
